

Education & Protection

In 2021, We continued providing academic education both in virtual and in-person approaches. We established close communication with school-going children through community resources. We provided education materials and emergency financial support to reduce dropout in COVID-19. Teacher's training has been designed considering social-emotional learning, distance, and virtual learning.

Community awareness on child rights and protection continued in deferent approaches. Small group community campaign, home visit of focus zone children, individual case based mentoring, motivation, and problem-solving by child rights keepers were emphasized in COVID-19. Child Council and Youth Council played an active and significant role to protect child rights. Child Council and Youth Council formed their new leadership through the election.

To ensure the equitable right to exercise basic health and increase accessibility to public health facilities Good Neighbors Bangladesh implemented health activities in urban and rural areas by qualified registered health professionals. GNB Health Care Unit provided quality primary health, reproductive health service and psychosocial support in community and change treatment service pattern in COVID-19 pandemic situation through telemedicine services. Community health promotion is aimed and achieved through creating mass awareness in different issues and change behavioral approach. This innovative approach is getting fruitful by empowering community and creating sustainable community volunteerism.

Income Generation

Improving community's livelihood through co-operative based individual entrepreneur development, income generation and social enterprise approaches are the main interventions of GNB to empower women and develop their livelihood. 3,412 community women newly involved in Co-operative –based IGA and 3 new co-operatives established in Ghatail, Kurigram and Kalarapa CDP areas in 2021.

Job creation status and the livelihood of underprivileged women are improving through Co-operatives, IGG and SE approaches which ultimately reduce the effect of poverty. CBOs are gaining profit, which indicated positive sign for their sustainability. Profit amount shared among co-operative members creating ownership among the co-operative members as well as co-operative management community. In addition operational system developed for ensuring transparency and capacity building of Co-operatives, IGG and SE management committee through training/ workshop in 2021.





Advocacy

Advocacy is one of the most significant elements in Good Neighbors movement. Protect and promote children, women and youths rights Good Neighbors Bangladesh gave emphasis on advocacy with government, private and public institutions. We had a great success in 2021 because formulating the National volunteer policy GNB was involved with UN Volunteer and Government. Through advocacy works GNB raised awareness for child labor, child marriage, dropout and child rights issues.





Community Partnership & Network Building

To increase partnership and networking activities, Good Neighbors Bangladesh initiated coordination meetings with 23 like-minded NGOs in 2021. GNB Also expand its partnership with the GN support countries, as well as new partnership and relationship built up with various funding partners through proposal development. GNB Cooperatives approach was introduced to local Government through GNB 25th Anniversary Co-operative Convention in November 3, 2021.

At the local level, GNB involved three (3) new CBOs, developed partnership with 15 new schools through MOU signing, engage and strengthen our volunteers' engagement for community development. Also partnership and networking buildup with BRAC and Grameen Bank.

Sponsorship Service

Systematic and efficient management of sponsored children for their wellbeing and child rights is the aim of GNB's sponsorship program. It matches the poorest of the poor children across the country with sponsors, so that they can receive support for fulfilling their basic needs and enhancing their overall quality of life. GNB was able to reduce the child dropout rate of sponsored children by taking special attention on regular home visit and counselling of focus and general zone children. In the last year dropout control rate was 99.99% among the 20,837 sponsored children which was a remarkable achievement in spite of this COVID-19 pandemic situation.

Not a single child deserves to suffer from violence, exploitation, abuse, and neglect. Our child protection program is based on the rights-based approach. We respect the views of the child, and zero tolerance for child exploitation and abuse. We work for raising awareness for the rights of the children so that they can claim their rights. To reduce the dropout rate we classified our children into two zones, General Zone (continuing in the study) Focus Zone (Possibility for engaging in child labor, under threat of marriage, and including all other cause that a child be dropped out).

Rohingya Emergency Response (RER) Project

Child-Centered Care for Rohingya Children and Adolescents

After the massive influx of Rohingya from Myanmar to Bangladesh in 2017, Good Neighbors Bangladesh has been providing humanitarian support to rohingya children, adolescent girls and women. From the time of emergency situation for the development of targeted group's physical, mental, social and measures to prevent Gender Based Violence against girls and women was the main concern of Good Neighbors Bangladesh. In accordance with those objectives GNB has been running 3 Child Friendly Spaces (CFS), 2 Women Friendly Spaces (WFS), and 5 Multi Purpose Child & Adolescent Center (MPCAC) in 3 rohingya refugee camps.

Good Neighbors Bangladesh (GNB) aims to improve the child protection through community engagement with a participatory approach on case management, PSS support and to spread-out risk mitigation message for the beneficiaries in the community. GNB operated its activities such as improving knowledge and strengthening structural PSS, life skills development from five Multipurpose Child and Adolescents Centre (MPCACs) in Camps 14, 15 & 16. In addition, GNB distributed houses for homeless in the host community with alliance of Bangladesh Government's instruction. All activities were designed focusing on the pandemic situation of COVID-19.

Rehana (25) Camp-16

I have been living in camp 16 with my three sons since the first day of the Rohingya influx in Bangladesh. I have desperately realized that life is tough for a young widow. I was mentally distressed as well as economically. Once a day, I have heard about the WFS of GNB. I do believe that was the turning point of my life.

I have gotten life skill and sewing training from the WFS of GNB, and now I am a tailor and a good tailor in my community. Every month I can earn near about 2000 taka.

Now I am happy in my life. I want to work hard for my sons' education. I convey my gratitude to the GNB. I believe Good Neighbors helped me increase my confidence, and now I am not scared of anything.

To raise awareness among the women, I am working now in my community, and I have involved myself as a DRR volunteer of a reputed organization.

A physically disabled child now improved the condition: An impact of counseling

Pihu is eight years old mentally and physically disabled child. She lives with her parents in the Rohingya refugee camp at Cox's Bazar. Due to her illness, her mother always tied her with a chain or rope in her house. Her parents work outside so it is not possible to keep an eye on her all the time.

One of GNB's volunteers has noticed the condition of this child and talked with her parents. The child is not mentally active, not able to understand anything, and she moves here and there without informing, that's why they always tied her up. Sometimes the child slept in the mud.

The volunteer discussed with her parents that if they treat the child positively then she can overcome it slightly. The volunteer also had given counseling to the parent and insisted them not to tie her.


After that, the volunteer referred the child to MOWCA (Ministry of Women and Children Affairs). Parents agreed to give MHPSS support for the child for three months. Doctors said the child's condition is improving and she had received all MHPSS sessions.

On the occasion of Mujib Borsho emphasized the development of the Host Community, GNB has got permission from the DC Office to construct 22 houses for the homeless. It's a part of the implementation of Asroyon Prokolpo-2 adopted by Honorable Prime Minister of the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh. Among these 22 houses, 10 houses in Ramu Upazila, 7 houses in Chokoria Upazila, and 5 houses in Cox's Bazar Sadar Upazila have been handed over.

Building Resilience to Achieve Zero Hunger (BRAZH) Project

Increase resilience and improve food security of people vulnerable to climate change

GNB Resilience Innovation program is working under BRAZH Project to increase the design and introduce tools for Forecast based Financing (FbF) and provide capacity assistance to the Government to use these tools to enable the pre-identification of relief participants, climate resilient among the disaster vulnerable community under sadar and ulipur upazila of Kurigram district. It will also try to reduce the consequences of the disaster risk and will bring some behavioral change in the community in terms of disaster preparedness & awareness. The project started to introduce and demonstrate the integrated seasonal livelihood mapping tools with relevant agencies in one upazila and strengthen climate resilient alternative livelihoods options for the poor and vulnerable people.

The objectives of the project is 'Design & practice innovative & appropriate method of FbF for targeted disaster-prone people to decrease their disaster vulnerabilities & reduce the gap of food insecurity through the project'. Project Location: Jatrapur union-Sadar upazila, Begumganj union-Ulipur upazila, Kurigram

I have gotten training from GNB on Seasonal Livelihood Program (SLP), Entrepreneurship Development Training (EDT) and Small Business. My family is traditionaly fisherman so I have made a business plan on Fishing Net as an alternative livelihood option.

From GNB I have received 15,000 taka for purchasing fishing net materials and we have made a complete fishing net by our combined effort me and my husband.

Through this net my husband everyday cathing fish and from June 2021 to September 2021 he have earned more than 28,000 taka excluding all cost.

I hope we can continue catching fish up to one year with this net.




GNB WFP BRAZH project organized training on Income Generating Activity and a total of 1,267 female participants have participated in these training.


Participants have been selected from our working area by a special survey conducted by WFP, selecting criteria are widow, landless, main income provider of a family, those who are divorce and are not getting any govt. support.

The objectives of the training are to increase women's involvement with Income Generating Activity (IGA), Self-dependent, economic stability.

After completion of the successful training, 831 participants have received 15,000tk (BDT) for Seasonal Livelihood Program (SLP) intervention to ensure their food security and economic sustainability through their IGA activities, and they gained profit from it.

Training of Ward Disaster Management Committee (WDMC)

The training of Ward Disaster Management Committee (WDMC) has been organized for 252 members from two unions. The training covered on the issue of identification of disaster vulnerabilities in ward level and discuss in Union Parishad to solve the problem and planning how they can ensure emergency support to community during disaster.

Training of Union Disaster Management Committee (UDMC)

Organized training for all members of UDMC at Jatrapur and Begumganj Unions where total 90 members attended and learned about roles & responsibilities of committee members, community needs identification and planning for upcoming disaster preparedness.

Entrepreneurship Development Training (EDT)

I have received training provided by GNB on EDT and IGA. During training, I have emphasized the daily income opportunity, so I have chosen the Small business like a small shop where I can run my business with my husband. Thanks to GNB for supporting me by providing training and capital for business. I am grateful to the GNB. Thanks!

The project has been completed 5 days long training on EDT with 1,441 beneficiaries at jatrapur union. The beneficiaries gained knowledge on alternative livelihoods, business ideas, selection of suitable business, risk & risk mitigation of business and planning of business for sustainable livelihoods.

Improvement of Maternal and Neonatal health through Community Health Workers Mobilization in Bochagnaj, Bangladesh

Improvement of the health and mortality situation in Bangladesh has been possible due to the successful implementation of large scale public health programs. To contribute in the health strategy of the Government of Bangladesh and to implement GNBs health agenda, we have introduced Community Health Workers (CHWs) project in a larger scale in Bochaganj, Dinajpur supported by KOICA.

The title of this project is 'Improvement of Maternal and Neonatal health through Community Health Workers Mobilization in Bochagnaj, Bangladesh' and the target area is 01 no. Nafanagar & 02 no Ishania Union, Bochaganj Upazila, Dinajpur, Bangladesh. This is a 3 years duration project from January 2019 to December 2021.

Health check-up campaign for the children

It is a landmark step in the first aid of students during this pandemic. Through this health campaign, four schools students received the medicine and a mono-psychological motivation. 


