GNB to the devastated families due to coronavirus with the token of love



Community Action Team (CAT) Members are delivering emergency food to the families those who stay away, Birganj CDP

When people around the world are in misery and hardship situations due to the Corona pandemic, Good Neighbors Bangladesh (GNB) has stood by the helpless people through food and hygiene items to 14 CDP areas in 9 districts.

In this work, we have formed a **Community Action Team (CAT)** with the participation of people from different professions from the community to take effective steps. This team visit house to house for collecting information and making a list of real helpless people. They purchase food items and hygiene items by analyzing the market prices, although this task was not easy at all during this lockdown. They packaged gift items and provide tokens to the beneficiaries for distribution to maintain safety and social distance.

During this distribution period, we try to ensure everyone's safety as well as staff, community action team members, and beneficiaries. The principle of our work was "Protection first, Actions Next-Senior takes care of the juniors". To emphasize the principle, we ensure personal protective equipment for all action team members as they have to move frequently.

Maintaining physical distance we have distributed emergency support as a token of love among 6,602 families. Most of them, our community action team ensured distribution by the door to door, to reduce the risk of coronavirus.

After getting the emergency food support most of the beneficiaries expressed their gratitude to the GNB. As per the statement of Asiya Khatun (40), Ghatail, Tangail "I am very thankful to the GNB for their support. Our family condition is not so good; due to lockdown for coronavirus, we can't lead our life as usual and can't go outside from home for work. So no work, no money, and family economic condition are also very bad. During this pandemic situation by COVID-19, our days are going through a lot of hardship. GNB comes to us when it is really needed for us."

We will continue such types of support to the devastated families due to coronavirus. We are planning to provide emergency food support phase 2 & hospital equipment related to COVID-19, and COVID-19 sample collection booths soon.

A field staff comment on how we complete the Emergency Releif Program 1

COVID-19 has hit all countries & all sectors. It is very difficult to find a county or a sector which is not affected by COVID-19. Due to COVID-19 crisis, worldwide economic growth has fallen down. The GDP of Bangladesh has also fallen down badly.

Pirganj CDP is situated in the Northern part of Bangladesh under Rangpur Division, Thakurgaon district. Most of the people are here living under the poverty line. Their consciousness is not at a satisfactory level. To protect the people from the pandemic of COVID-19, Pirganj CDP arranged a huge number of awareness sessions in the community. Before getting the first case of COVID-19 positive in Bangladesh, we have arranged an awareness session for all sector's leaders of the community.

Upazila Health & Family Planning Officer and Senior Consultant of Gynae Department facilitated the awareness session. During assembly time of school, all core staff of Pirganj CDP went to different schools & took a session on COVID-19. For creating mass awareness, we have distributed leaflets & installed bill-board in different public places.

When Bangladesh Government declared general leave, all the mills-factories, private offices, institutions, hotels & restaurants, and even government offices almost closed in this pandemic situation of COVID-19. A huge number of people became jobless. They came back at home and day labors of the community could not go out for earning. That was a terrible situation in the community. Respecting govt.'s decision, we were at home during lockdown time.

Though we were at home, we were worried about the distress people of the community. Then we have planned how can we assist them in the crisis time. We negotiated with the UNO office and started our support in the community. 1st phase we supported 500 families from our fund. Through our relief programs, we supported food items, hygiene kits, to the community people.

When people were suffering from any disaster, we raised our helping hand for them. During the flood, when people lost their house, we supported more than one hundred houses in the Upazila besides food, health & hygienes kits supports. During the cold wave, we supported a blanket every year. Now in the COVID-19 pandemic situation, though we have the risk of life, we could not stay at home. We came out from home and stay beside our distress people of the community.

During lockdown situations, we faced lots of challenges like purchasing relief items, maintaining social distance during relief work, beneficiary selection, wearing PPE & other protective measures during hot temperature. We overcome all challenges. Community Action Team members & all responsible officials of the Government cooperate with us. We followed all safety measures properly. It is good to say that no one is infected from COVID-19 of our team and also our beneficiaries.

I am very happy to get the chance to work for this vulnerable group during this pandemic situation. Thanks all for supporting us.

An initiative to decrease damages and losses during the disaster

Forecast based financing (FbF) is a program that enables access to humanitarian funding for early action based on in-depth forecast information and risk analysis. The goal of FbF is to anticipate disasters, prevent their impact, if possible, and reduce human suffering and losses.

Based on flood forecast UNWFP provided FbF support through the 'GNB Building Resilience to Achieve Zero Hunger (BRAZH)' project for the targeted beneficiaries. Under the project total of 2,551 beneficiaries received support and Each beneficiary received Taka. 4,500/- through mobile bKash account.

The support ensured their food security during the disaster period and decrease the damages and losses. This support assisted to all targeted beneficiaries taking effective preparedness, shifting to a safe place, and fill up the food crisis during the disaster period. Forecast based financing to support efficient relief mechanism and strengthen the social protection program that will enable risk preparedness and risk reduction.

Flood forecast message dissemination

Through Building Resilience to Achieve Zero Hunger Project flood forecast 5/10 days' message disseminated by project volunteer. Volunteer received conducive materials from union disaster management committee for being

well equipped. Volunteer groups received messages from project office and also ffwc website and they started the disseminated flood forecast message as per plan.

They hired boat for char areas and usually used mega phone for loud speaker. In some cases, they also hired miky/large speaker for dissemination the message largely. Volunteer tried to cover the whole targeted areas for message dissemination. They helped the flood affected community people in the char areas to shift the safe places.

Considering the flood bulleting we started the disseminated flood forecast message second time in our targeted areas. Two times in this year flood forecast messages disseminated in the working areas. A flood warning message developed by radio chilmari and disseminated the message by mike in the both areas.

24/SDC & SBA accommodation construction completed in Bochagani

KOICA-GNB CHW project has completed 24/7 Safe Delivery Center & SBA accommodation construction in June 2020 in the premise of Ishania & Nafanagar UH&FWC of Bochaganj.

These two 24/7 SDC will be equipped with proper medical equipment & medicine and the project's skilled midwife will provide MNCH service 24 hours with UH&FWC health staff. Through this health facility, 46,885 community people will be benefited directly & indirectly for better maternal neonatal child health (MNCH) service.
